

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO MONITOR THE HEALTH OF THE RIVER BRENT

Thames21 are setting up a Riverfly Monitoring Initiative (RMI) on the River Brent in 2019. The RMI is a national scheme for monitoring the health of rivers developed by the Riverfly Partnership.

RMI sampling uses the presence and abundance of invertebrates in a sample to gauge the health of your river. Free training in the sampling method will be provided by the Zoological Society of London.

In the training you will learn:

- The theory of the RMI and how it helps improve rivers
- How to kick sample a river
- How to identify river invertebrates and score a sample
- What to do with the data you collect

You will also meet other volunteers working to protect the River Brent.
